Community Engagement for Research and Teaching through Service (CERTS)

CERTS is an interdisciplinary effort supported by the University Senate Council and through the University Community Outreach Partnership Center to establish cross-campus collaborations to support Research Service Learning projects and courses, especially where multi-disciplinary teams of faculty and students can work with a community partner around community-identified issues and projects that draws on expertise and resources of university partners. CERTS projects should mutually benefit community partners and the research, teaching and scholarship of the faculty and graduate students. Nearly a dozen schools and disciplines are already at the CERTS table. CERTS is currently forming initiatives with Oakland community partners on development and implementation of an Oakland Comprehensive Plan, an effort that grew out of an earlier Senate Plenary on “The Future of Oakland.” Join us to learn more about Oakland and its many neighborhoods, the Oakland Neighborhood Enhancement Program, and how you and your students can become a partner in Oakland’s future.
