Project Abstract

Various research techniques were used in order to explore the topics of Music Mountain and Glen Charles. The process of collecting oral histories, photographs, and newspaper articles about these topics is described. Music Mountain is an area where a unique pool of oil was discovered in a wildcatting venture on August 24th, 1937. Glen Charles was an old logging settlement that was active for only five years (1895-1900). In addition, any information found on the West Branch of the Tunagawant River was to be collected. The final collection of research went to the Penn-Brad Oil Well Museum, the Allegheny National Forest, and to the University of Pittsburgh at Bradford faculty database.
