

The University of Pittsburgh (UP) and the Community College of Allegheny County (CCAC) agree to cooperate in facilitating the transfer of students from CCAC to UP in order to pursue baccalaureate degrees in the College of Arts and Sciences (CAS). Within the appended document which was developed jointly by UP and CCAC representatives, a program of study has been articulated as the equivalent to the Skills and General Education requirements in CAS, except two Writing-intensive Courses, and the requirement in Non-western Foreign Culture which must be completed after the student transfers. The Foreign Language Requirement may be completed either at CCAC or in CAS. The complete document details the circumstances under which CCAC students will be accepted into the CAS and awarded junior academic status. Modifications of the enclosed document must occur through formal notification, and the formal revision of this agreement.

This program of study will be considered equivalent to the Skills and General Education Requirements in the College of Arts and Sciences, except for the Foreign Language Requirement and two writing-intensive courses (see below), and the requirement in non-western foreign culture which must be completed after you transfer. Please note the following:

- (1) **Grades:** In order for these credits to transfer successfully, you must earn a C or better in each course with a cumulative QPA of 2.50 or better.
- (2) **Writing Requirement:** Please bring two papers that you believe represent your best writing in college composition courses when you come for your orientation. Please be sure to label each paper as follows: your name, social security number, title of the course the paper was written for, and date the paper was submitted to your professor(s). Also, please submit copies rather than originals, since they will not be returned to you. The English Department will evaluate these papers to determine your status with regard to the CAS composition requirement and the number of transfer credits you will receive for English Composition.
- (3) **Natural Science Requirement:** CAS requires a sequence in either life science or physical science, and one additional course in the other (e.g., BIO 151 & 152 and CHM 151).
- (4) **Foreign Language Requirement:** Prior to graduation from CAS, you must also have fulfilled the Foreign Language Requirement either by having completed three years of a single foreign language in high school with a C or better or by completing the first two terms of a foreign language of your choice either at CCAC or in CAS with a C or better.
- (5) **Non-Western Foreign Culture:** Before graduating from CAS, you must complete 9 credits of international studies with a grade of C or better; you may review options among CCAC courses with your advisor, consider cross-registration to one of the PCHE institutions, or delay this requirement until you are in attendance at CAS.
- (6) **Graduation from CCAC:** You are encouraged to receive the Associate in Arts degree at CCAC before transfer. A total of sixty credits can be accumulated by selecting additional courses listed as options above or by meeting with an advisor to select a CCAC course appropriate to your anticipated concentration in CAS and determining its course equivalence by consulting the current issue of Pitt Connection.
- (7) **Junior Status:** If you complete the above requirements, you will be accepted into the College of Arts and Sciences and awarded junior status.
