Although he had lost most of his hearing, and had significant surgery, he always bounced back and showed up for his games. He never complained, and enjoyed his chess very much. Club member Rodney Strychor died February 9th of injuries sustained in a fall. He was born in Sewickley in 1955, and was active in Pittsburgh-area chess for many years while an undergraduate and graduate student at Carnegie Mellon University. He was playing in the Pittsburgh Chess League this year for the University of Pittsburgh Chess Team. His family has donated his collection of 300 chess books to the club library. We extend our condolences to the families of both.

### Chess News for Juniors by Beth Harrison

Record Breaking Attendance: The Tri-State Junior Open set a new record for Pittsburgh chess attracting 265 scholastic players from 91 schools. The tournament was held January 6, at Carnegie Mellon University. Forty-four individual trophies, four team trophies, and scores of ribbons were awarded to top players in eight sections. The tournament was organized by NM Jerry Meyers. Tournament Revived: After a hiatus of several years, the U.S. Junior Chess Congress was revived. The national event was held in Columbus, Ohio, over the Martin Luther King Day weekend. Two hundred eighteen students from eleven states competed in six age-based sections. A large contingent of over 30 players from Pittsburgh, Monroeville, and the surrounding area traveled to Columbus for the five-round G/90 event. Trophies were awarded to the top ten players and top five teams in each section. The first place player in each section was named the USCF National Champion for that age group. Award winners from Western PA in each section included Age 8 & Under: Neiladri Khan, 2<sup>nd</sup> place; Mark Heimann, 4<sup>th</sup> place; Delbert Tyler, 10th place; Age 10 & Under: Hari Seshadri, 4th place; Age 12 & Under: Mathew Lederman, 6th plac Andrew Krut, 9th place; Ezra Jampole, Top Class D; Gateway Middle School, 4th place team; Age 14 & Under: Michael Booth, 1st place and national champion; Zhipeng Sun, 3<sup>rd</sup> place; Ryan Milisits, 5<sup>th</sup> place; Taylor Allderdice High School, 2<sup>nd</sup> place team; and Fox Chapel Area High School, 3<sup>rd</sup> place team. Congratulations to National Champion Michael Booth and all our great chess players!

**Newsmakers:** Our junior chess players have many talents. Brittney Lay was named 2001 Sportsperson of the Year for the Dapper Dan Youth Sports Leagues and was in the *Pittsburgh* 

Post-Gazette Sports section. Patrick Harrison won the Dorseyville Middle School Geography Bee and will travel to Harrisburg this spring to compete in the Pennsylvania State Geography Bee. And Peng Sun won first place in his division in the Calcu-Solve Bowl. Peng was recently featured as a North Young Achiever in the Pittsburgh Tribune-Review.

PA State Championships Reminder: The 2001 Pennsylvania Scholastic Chess Championships will be held March 10 - 11, at Bloomsburg University, Bloomsburg, PA. Entry fees increased by \$10 for entries received February 18 through March 3; \$20 extra is required after March 3 or on site. ### Puzzles for Juniors by Rich Barbara

Thank you to all who sent or gave me feedback. I hope to integrate some of your suggestions as time passes and I become more comfortable and familiar with editing a puzzle column. As this "puzzle column" (and I do use those words very loosely) is my first attempt to do anything like this, I will be doing a certain amount of experimentation. It is my intention to vary from issue to issue the level of difficulty and telling you whether or not there is a theme to the puzzles. Please feel free to e-mail me at Rich\_Barbara@hotmail.com with any suggestions or requests.

As I see it there are two reasons to do puzzles. One is for the challenge and enjoyment of solving a puzzle and the second for improving your play.

If you're about improving your play, here are a few suggestions on how to use the puzzles to improve your tactics:

- Set the pieces up on the board.
- Once they are set up do not touch them. Try to do it all in your mind.
- If you find the puzzle difficult, make your brain work, push yourself.

- If you still haven't solved the puzzle after about 5 minutes, go ahead and play through the solution until you understand it. Then go on to the next puzzle.
- At a later time go back to the puzzle you weren't able to solve. Try again. Repeat this process until you can solve the puzzle.

This is hard work. You're asking your mind to do something that it is not in the habit of doing. BE PATIENT. Chess is hard enough without us "beating ourselves up" every time we have difficulty.

In this issue I have two puzzles for you. Both are much harder then the last set of puzzles and are taken from actual games. Enjoy!!!!

The puzzles appear on the opposite page and the solutions are upside-down below.





### **Strong Scholastic Players**


After years in which it seemed like chess was becoming an old man's game, Pittsburgh now has several strong players who aren't even out of ninth grade. Ryan Milisits is an Expert, Justin Papariella is high in Class A, and Michael Booth is Class B. Who can guess how far they will go? Here are some other kids who have shown their talent in Pittsburgh chess during their high school years: Vivek Rao was a Senior Master when he graduated, around 1987; he is now an IM. Jon Yedidia, also now an IM, was a Master when he graduated, around 1978. Bill Surlow (graduated recently), Kip Rapp (early 1990's), and Chris Avery (70's or 80's) were Experts. And yours truly weighed in at about 1700 upon graduating from Lebo in 1969. Oops, how did that one get on the list?

With the tremendous growth in Scholastic chess, our scholastic players can travel to several regional and national scholastic tournaments in the course of a year. Ryan and Michael faced each other in the last round of the 9th grade section of the National K-12 Grade Chamionships in Orlando in December, and Ryan won; but only a month later, in the US Junior Chess Congress in Columbus, they played again and this time Michael won. In the Orlando tournament, Ryan went 5-1 in his section, losing only to the tournament winner, Jacobs, and finishing second. In the Columbus tournament, Michael finished first. Here are the two games.

This move is the almost automatic freeing move in both the Dragon and the Accelerated Dragon. White should have avoided it by 7 Bc4 or maybe 8 Bc4. Black is at least equal now; in the regular Dragon, Black will even lose a tempo to play this move, getting excellent compensation for a pawn sacrifice. I can't resist the temptation to give the complete score of the flashy recent game Adams-Fedorov, from the Wijk aan Zee grandmaster tournament of only a month ago: 1 e4 c5 2 Nf3 d6 3 d4 cxd4 4 Nxd4 Nf6 5 Nc3 g6 6 Be3 Bg7 7 f3 Nc6
