



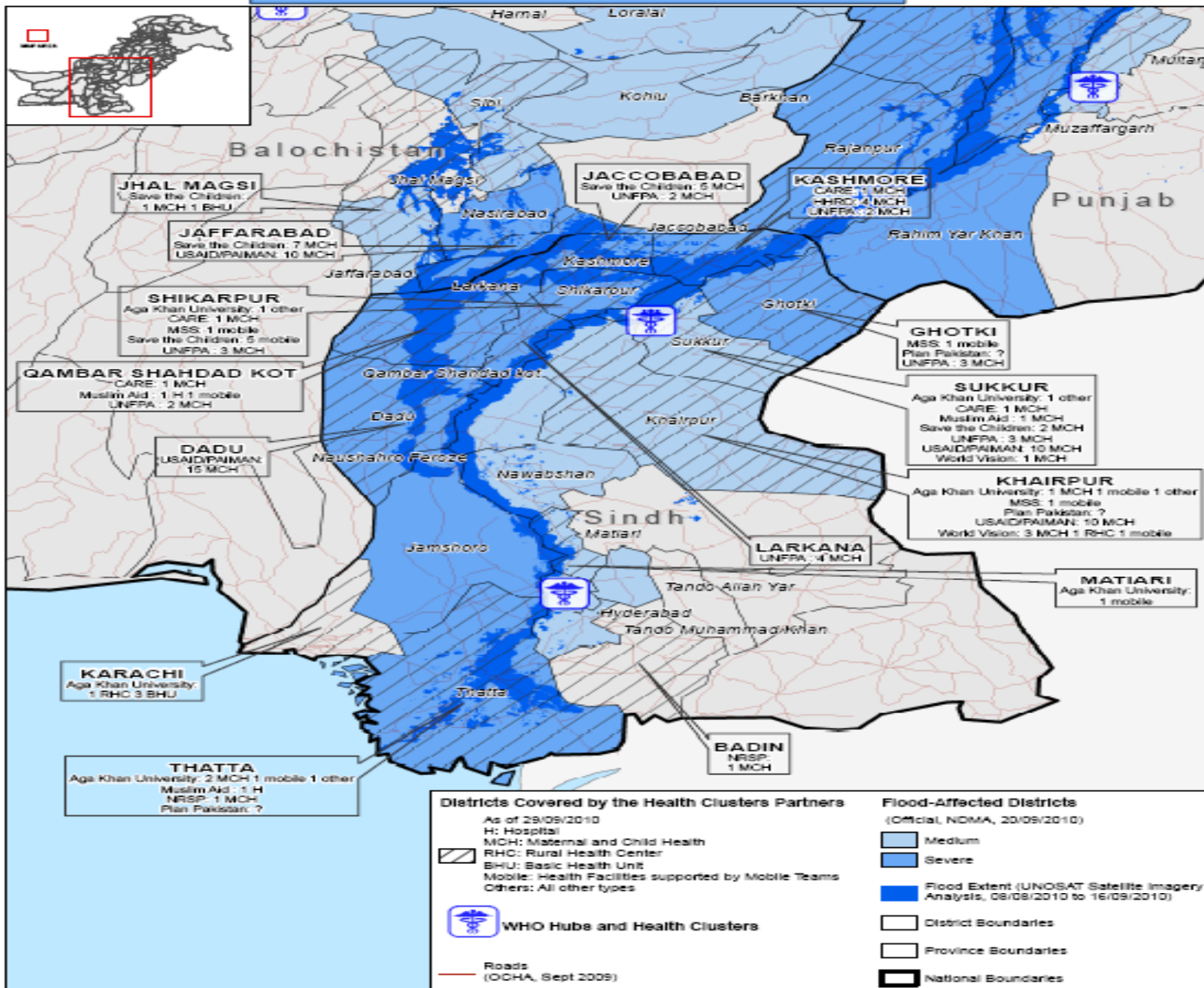

Scope of disaster

- Total districts – 23
- Districts in south Sindh - 14
- Districts affected – Seven
- Districts hosting IDPs - Five
- Population affected - 2.556 million
- Houses affected - .386 million
- Area affected – 3.94 million acres
- Health facilities damaged - 87

WHO response

- Started daily camp report from Hyderabad office – August 7, 2010
- Hyderabad hub started
- First health cluster meeting – September 8, 2010
- Started supply of medicine to districts in August 2010.
- DTC started – Mid August 2010 at Thatta
- NSC started – last week of September at Jamshoro
- HeRAM surevy
